PERSONNEL (Jon Knittel)

One part time position opening is being posted to our webpage and at the Scale. We currently have 7 full time field personnel and 1 part timer on staff for operations at the landfill.

PRESENTATION

REPORTS

- State and Federal Fish and Wildlife, as well as animal control has worked with PCFA to investigate why local eagles got sick on two dates in April. Preliminary lab results indicate that PCFA was Not the cause of the illness as the Eagles stomach content DNA indicates that they ate Pig and Cow euthanized by a Vegetarian with the drug Pentobarbital. During all of April 2026, the landfill did not take any euthanized pigs or cows. Hauling records and onsite video review indicate that only euthanized horses arrived in April. All were buried immediately upon arrival. No violations were found at PCFA and we were commended for helping quickly get several of the Eagles to help. All 8 of the hospitalized eagles have fully recovered and have been released.

FACILITIES/RECYCLING (Jon Knittel)

- Cell 6A: Topsoil is still in place and has good ground vegetative cover to prevent soil erosion. PCFA continues to stockpile rock for onsite crushing this Fall. We plan to finish cutting in the access road this Summer followed by placing stone and concrete barrier block along areas that have steep slopes below.
- Wastewater Treatment Plant Team continues perusing BRIC (Building Resilient Infrastructure Communities) grant application for a potential FEMA BRIC grant to build a high-pressure reverse osmosis wastewater treatment system in our existing treatment building. PCFA has met the requirements to be included in the Warren County Hazard Mitigation Plan to be grant eligible. Plan adoption by Resolution will take place later in the year. The BRIC grant application has been turned in to local NJEOM for review and then subsequent submission to FEMA.
- Gas Collection Expansion: Two (2) caisson gas wells were purchased and delivered last week. These two wells will be manually placed on the blanket stone in Cell 7 along a rain flap that will be removed in late July. Trash will be placed around the caissons and these two gas extraction points can be activated once several lifts of trash has been placed in that area.

- PCFA staff and our Engineer are working on a draft RFP for our flare gas utilization. We currently understand that WAGA type companies utilizing our flare gas to make RNG (Renewable Natural Gas) is likely the most economical and sustainable option but we will be open to all potential technologies that could utilize our flare gas.
- PCFA had a machine reach end of life in a transmission failure. Our 1999 Volvo Autocar Roll off truck has been retired as the result of this mechanical failure. We need to have two Roll off trucks at all times for pulling bins at the convenience centers and for carrying our dust control tank/sprayer. An emergency purchase of a replacement used Roll off was implemented in order to meet our Solid Waste Permit requirements and to continue providing adequate services. A used 2018 Kenworth T880 was purchased for \$125,900 (including delivery) after comparing 4 vehicles in NJ, IA, PA and CT. The funds used for this purchase was from our previously approved 2026 Capital Budget.
